Cymbal Line 1: **FLAT CRASH** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cymbal Line 2: **LEAD CRASH** (Clef: F#) - 1st note has a downward arrow, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cymbal Line 3: **CRASH CHOKE** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cymbal Line 4: **PRESS** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cymbal Line 5: **CYMBAL ROLL** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cym. 1: **ZING** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot with a wavy line above it, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cym. 2: **PING** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot with a plus sign below it, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cym. 3: **SIZZLE** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot with two diagonal lines above it, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cym. 4: **HI-HAT CLOSED** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot with an X below it, 2nd note is a hollow dot.

Cym. 5: **HI-HAT OPEN** (Clef: F#) - 1st note is a solid dot with an X below it, 2nd note is a hollow dot with a circle above it.
